A New Freshwater Shrimp Host, *Macrobrachium faustinum* (de Saussure), and Locality Record, Puerto Rico, for the Bopyrid Isopod *Probopyrus pandalicola* (Packard)

The bopyrid isopod, *Probopyrus pandalicola* (Packard), infects six species of freshwater shrimp throughout the West Indies (Table 1) and others from New Hampshire to Florida along the Atlantic coast of the USA, the Atlantic coast of South America to Brazil, and the Pacific coast of Panama (Kensley and Schotte, 1989). The freshwater shrimp, *Macrobrachium faustinum* (de Saussure), occurs throughout the West Indies and along the Atlantic coast of South America to Brazil (Chace and Hobbs, 1969). We report specimens of *P. pandalicola* from *M. faustinum* taken from the Guayanilla River in southwestern Puerto Rico (United States National Museum Crustacean Collection isopods and shrimp). These records in *M. faustinum* represent a new host. Holthuis (1977) identified the isopods he found in this host in Cuba as "bopyrids" and "bran-

chial bopyrid parasite". Kensley and Schotte (1989) assumed that this material represented *P. pandalicola*, apparently based on the rather confusing synonym list of Markham (1985, p. 27-29). Markham (1985) did not re-examine the material of Holthuis, and listed the bopyrid from *M. faustinum* as "unidentified" (Markham, 1985: 128).

Our records represent a new locality record for Puerto Rico where this bopyrid occurs commonly with this host but in no other shrimp or crab found in extensive backpack electrofishing collections made around the island (Schmidt-Gengenbach and Holmquist, unpublished). We examined representative subsamples from their collections and found only *P. pandalicola*.

The only other specimens of this bopyrid collected from the northeastern Caribbean have been a female and a cryptoniscan larva from the Dominican Republic and an immature female from St. Croix. Few other records exist from the entire insular Caribbean: a pair from Cuba [listed as questionable by Markham (1985: 128)] and a pair from Martinique. Seven specimens had been reported in the insular Caribbean previously.
